

# Proper Use of MBH Genuine Rope-Ties

## TO INSURE THE BEST RESULTS...

- 1 Use our J-Hooks
- 2 Mount J-Hooks on the wall or to a table with our J-Hook Swivel Stand
- 3 Use the same color of buttons on each J-Hook, allowing all shirts on J-Hook for same treatment. *Colors can mean starch amount, delivery route, day of week etc.*

## PRODUCT BENEFITS

- Eliminate shake out labor preparing shirts for shirt unit
- Dramatically increasing mechanical action makes shirts cleaner
- Mechanical action is directed to collars and cuffs – no more scrubbing collars
- Unloading is easier and faster without tangled sleeves
- Stop buying nets and pins
- Wash more shirts per load saving water, time and detergents
- Save floor space because you do not need racks to hang open order lost shirts.  
  
Shirts tied together stay together thus eliminating open orders

## HOW TO ATTACH

- 1 Nest up to 8 shirts together with collars folded up on the J-Hook.
- 2 Slide one Rope-Tie over the shirts about 9" down from the top. Squeeze the color button fully and pull the toggle handle or pull one string tight.
- 3 Slide the second Rope-Tie over the shirts about 9" up from the cuffs and tighten.
- 4 Lift the log of shirts off the J-Hook. They are ready to wash now.
- 5 After washing, hang the log of shirts back on the J-Hook for easy removal of the Rope-Ties. To release, squeeze the button fully, hold the shirts and pull the button down or pull the rope. *The shirts are now ready for finishing with no shaking out required.*
- 6 The unique design of the tie button can be a bit confusing. The rope actually crosses in the button, so to release, pull the opposite rope of the one with the toggle handle.

## RECOMMENDATIONS FOR THE BEST RESULTS

1. Instruct counter staff to group single and 2 shirt orders into one basket
2. After an order is tagged, write up a separate ticket for bleeders (cold water). This will eliminate open orders hanging, waiting for the missing shirt(s).
3. Use one J-Hook for each color tie for that "starch" classification.
4. Hang shirts collar to collar with same classification on a J-Hook.
5. On orders of 3 shirts or more (up to 8 shirts) tie the order. Combine 2 shirt orders with single orders.
6. Use 2 ties for each "log". A log is the bundled shirts.
7. Combine and tie single and 2 shirt orders into "logs" up to 8 shirts per log.
8. Load the logs into the washer to capacity (average - 2 shirts per pound).
9. After washing, place the log on a J0Hook for easy removal of the ties.
10. Place the released shirts into a damp box, collar to collar. Each order is laying together, ready to press. Shake out has been eliminated and the shirts will come off the press sorted and assembled.
